



In July 2020 with the support of the international organization GIZ an international webinar on the «Categorization of participants of foreign economic activity within the framework of the system of risk management» for the countries of Central Asia was held and lasted 3 days: On July 7, 8 - on categorization of the participants of the FEC, on July 13 - on analysis of risks at the stage of post-customs audit.

The webinar was conducted in Russian, using the «CISCO WEBEX» platform.

The purpose of the webinar was to assist the public revenue authorities of the Republic of Kazakhstan in studying the best practices of the Baltic countries in the application of tools for classifying PFEA within a system of risk management.

The following experts from the customs services of the Baltic States served as lecturers:

The participants of the international webinar were representatives of the customs services of the Kyrgyz Republic, the Republic of Uzbekistan and the Republic of Tajikistan, and employees of the revenue agencies of the Republic

of Kazakhstan working in the units responsible for the implementation of the customs risk management system, and for the post-customs audit.

During the webinar, participants exchanged views, asked questions to experts of the customs services of the Baltic countries on the categorization of foreign trade participants, risk analysis at the post-customs audit stage, and other issues raised in this international event
